Board Reviews Survey Results

On February 18, 2009, the Board reviewed the surveys used to evaluate the effectiveness of the Congregation, Board, and Rabbi. The Board would like to thank everyone who took the time to give input.

There have been many changes at Mount Sinai over the last eight months. The biggest has been the hiring of Rabbi Moon and having a rabbinical presence in Cheyenne after almost 20 years. There are inherent difficulties in this transition. The disruption of our traditions is an issue any new religious leader would experience. The Board realizes that we can not please all the people all the time and hopes our efforts reflect the desire of the majority of our community.

The survey results illustrate this situation. Thirty-two surveys were reviewed, a response rate of 35%, which is above the 25% average rate of return for this type of survey. Approximately nineteen were positive, eight were negative, and five were neutral. These results were approximate, but three independent evaluations of survey results were not significantly different.

There were some common themes in the constructive criticism. Respondents indicated a need for shorter services, more community outreach, and recruitment of new members. Those participating in the educational and social programs enjoyed them. Another common thread was the need for a full time Rabbi.

In light of the survey requests, and a unanimous vote by the Board, we are now negotiating a new contract with Rabbi Moon. The Board appreciates the congregation's patience and support during this past year.

Purim Baskets

We are looking forward to delivering many Purim baskets to our members and other Jewish families in the Cheyenne area. The baskets are chock full of delicious kosher goodies and our new Mt. Sinai mugs are sure to be collectors' items. Our thanks to everyone who has participated in this project. Our special thanks to Rabbi Moon, who got the ball rolling!





ARINNA'S ARENA

Dear Congregants,

As I write this column, it is Rosh Hodesh Adar. The month of Adar is associated with happiness. In the Purim story, the evil Haman cast lots to decide when to kill the Jews and the lot (pur) fell on the month of Adar. Therefore the rabbis stated, "With the start of the month of Adar we greatly increase joy."

There are four mitzvot associated with this holiday. The first one is to hear the megillah – the story of Queen Esther and her Uncle Mordechai and how they saved the Jewish people from destruction. The story is a farce and the numerous plot devices point to the whimsical nature of the tale. God is not mentioned at all in this text, perhaps because it would be irreverent to mention God in such a comic setting. The levity of the book gives the holiday its joyous character and the threat to the Jews is never taken seriously. You can observe this mitzvah by coming to the synagogue and hearing the story read. Dress up as your favorite character and get into the spirit. Noise makers will be provided to drown out the name of Haman.

The second mitzvah we observe is having a festive meal on the afternoon of Purim. We're going to get a head start by having goodies after the megillah reading, however you and your friends and family are encouraged to get together the next day and celebrate with food. The third mitzvah is mishloach manot, sending gifts of food to friends. This year we have inaugurated the Purim Basket Project in which congregants can buy lovely gift baskets made by Mt. Sinai members that are delivered directly to the homes of other Jewish community members. Be on the lookout for yours between March 5th and March 10th, weather permitting.

The fourth and final mitzvah is giving money to the poor. Of course this is a commandment we should observe throughout the year, but it gives us special pleasure to be able to help out others in need during this holiday. It also helps others to be able to enjoy the festival as well.

Purim is a time to let loose and feel good; an opportunity to masquerade as someone other than yourself. After all of the persecutions that Jews have faced throughout history, this holiday affirms the bright moments of victory and helps us to balance the hard times with genuine joy. Purim is celebrated on the 14th of Adar which this year falls on March 10th. And since holidays always begin the evening before, we will be celebrating Purim on the evening of March 9th. Come join in the fun of this topsy-turvy holiday and let's rejoice together as a community. And may the month of Adar be especially happy for you and your family.
