Speeches calling for the destruction of Israel and others in parades not allowing messages indicating you can be both Zionist and anti-human trafficking.

Of these items, the worst of course is the one where a fatality resulted. Strong statements of opinion do not have to lead to physical violence, yet all too often we see that individuals take these opinions as fact and attempt to physically destroy all those who have differing views, since they disagree with what the individual takes to be true.

Being incorrect is not a reason to be harmed, either physically or emotionally. Debated with, possibly, but not harmed. When the entire world has learned this, we will all be much better off.
