I need to express our gratitude to the Cheyenne Jewish Community. You have been supportive, willing to step up and pitch in as needed. You have also done me the favor of presuming that I will heal within the coming year and will be able to return to work.

The past few weeks I have been able to meet with students in-between medical procedures and appointments, so I have felt a tiny bit productive.

In the meantime, may God open up the storehouse of healing to all those who need it: the sick, the injured, the medical professionals dealing with them, the caregivers filling in the gaps, and the rest of us who may not be sure how to help other than continuing to pray.
